Domestic Violence Prohibition Act -2005-Provisions Under Act

The programme of Domestic violence Prohibition Act -2005-Provisions Under Act organized under Internal Complaint Committee, on 9-4-2022 Total 117 students and parents were attended the programme. This programme was organized under Gender Equality Sensation. Domestic violence against women is highly prevalent in India and the women usually try to hide it. Particularly wife beating or physical mistreatment is a very common phenomenon in many Indian homes. The percentage of women who are exposed to violence by their husbands is 45% in India. Despite this widespread prevalence, such violence is not customarily acknowledge and has remained invisible. Background conditions of females are found to play a significant role in domestic violence.

Dr. S.H.Ambawade the Presiding Officer of the Internal Complaint committee introduced the chief guest and explained the objectives of the programme. The president of the programme Principal Dr. V.A.Mane expressed the presidential remark. He expressed that it the need of era to organize such type of programme in the college, at the college stage the students should aware about the violence. He further focused that 80% girl students are took the admission in our college. So it is our responsibility to organize such type of programme in our college to make aware the girls students, and to council to boy students. In the first session of the programme Adv. A.B.khandekar has explained the various provisions under Domestic Violence Prohibition Act- 2005. He also focused on the definition of the Domestic violence Act-2005.

World HEALTH Organization (WHO) has defined Domestic Violence Act-2005 "the range of sexually, psychologically and physically coercive act used against adult and adolescent women by current or former male intimate partners" violence is often not restricted to the current husband, but may extend to boyfriends, former husbands and other family members such as parents, siblings and in-laws.

He also focused on the Information to Protection officer and exclusion liability of informant. Duties of police officers, service providers and magistrate, Duties of shelter homes. Duties of medical facilities. Appointment of Protection Officers, Duties and functions of protection Officers. Service providers, Duties of government etc.

The second session conducted by Ad A.A. Khandekar. She explained on the topic Domestic violence prohibition Act- 2005 Awareness towards Woman. She highlighted on the Chapter IV procedure for obtaining orders of relief Application of Magistrate. Service of notice. Counseling, Assistance of welfare expert. Proceeding to be held on camera. Right to reside in a shared household., Protection orders. Residence orders. Monetary reliefs. Custody orders. Compensation orders, power to grant interim and ex parte orders. Court to give copies of order free of cost, Duration of orders. Relief in other suits and legal proceedings, Jurisdiction, Procedure etc.
